What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the AMP Defensive Conservative Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. AMP Wealth Management New Zealand Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

Description of this fund

The fund has a diversified portfolio that primarily invests in lower-risk income assets with a conservative allocation to growth assets. The fund aims to preserve the value of your investments and achieve modest returns, in exchange there may be small movements up and down in the value of your investments. This fund is closed to new investors.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the AMP Defensive Conservative Fund:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Note that even the lowest category does not mean a risk-free investment, and there are other risks that are not captured by this rating.

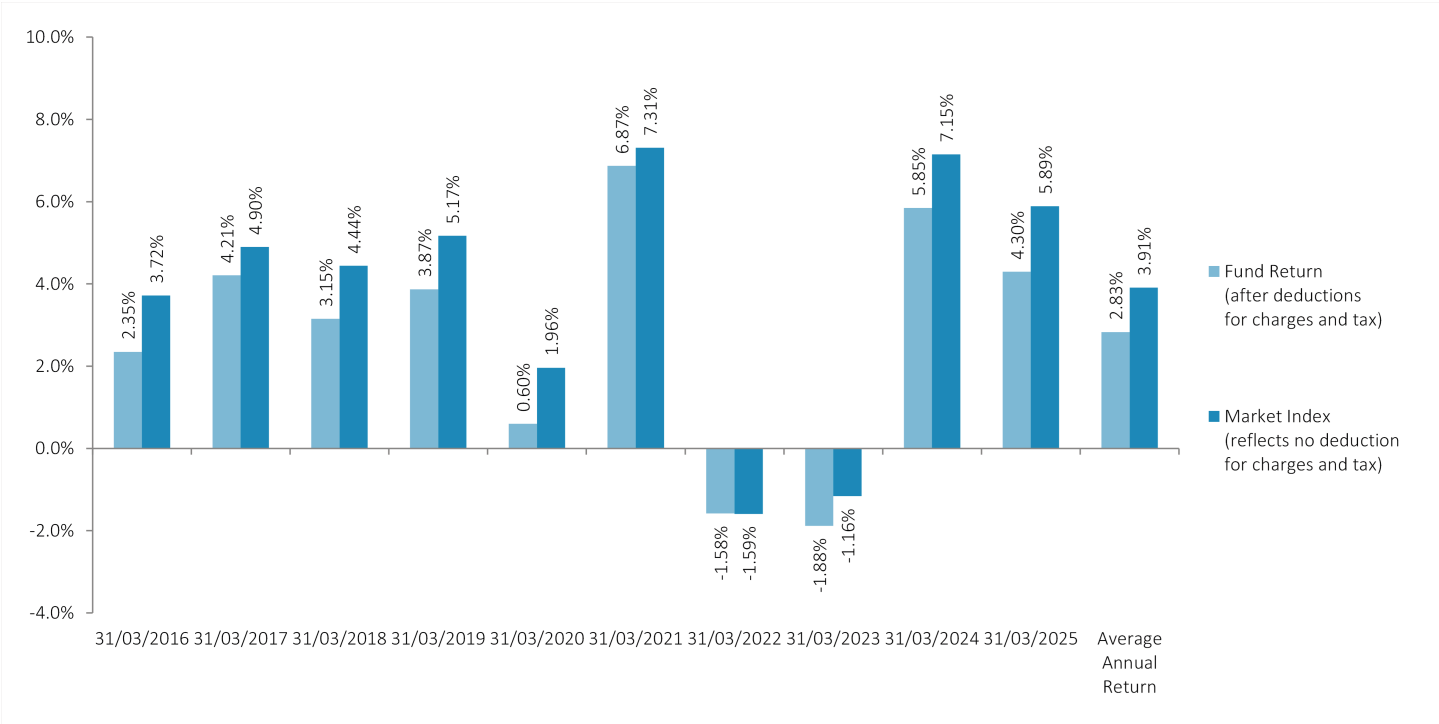

How has the fund performed?

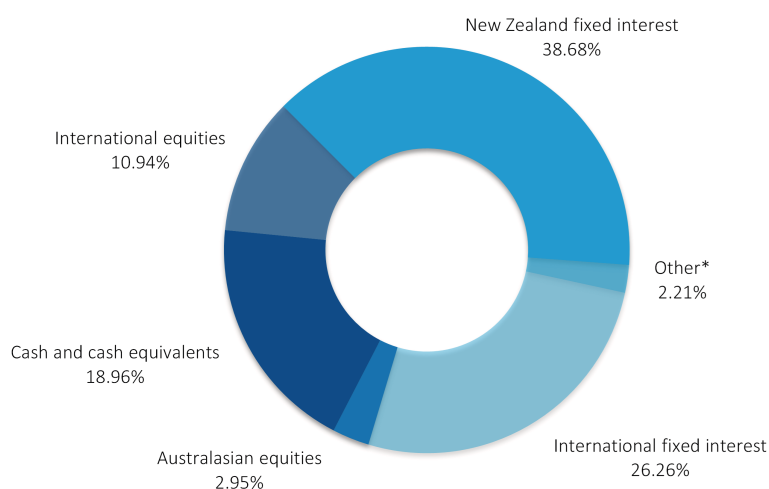
Example of how this applies to an investor

Craig had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Craig received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$534.00 (that is 5.34% of his initial \$10,000). Craig also paid \$23.40 in other charges. This gives Craig a total return after tax of \$510.60 for the year.

Currency hedging

The fund will (or will invest in underlying funds that will) target:

- fully hedging foreign currency exposure from International fixed interest and Australasian equities;
 - hedging foreign currency exposure from International equities – Developed markets at 60% hedged to New Zealand dollars; and
 - not hedging foreign currency exposure from International equities – Emerging markets.
- a range of foreign currency hedging may be used at the discretion of the Manager - Other - Direct infrastructure.
