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### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Kōura Wealth KiwiSaver Scheme Strategic High Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Kōura Wealth Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

### What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the Strategic High Growth Fund<sup>1</sup>:

## Example of how this applies to an investor:

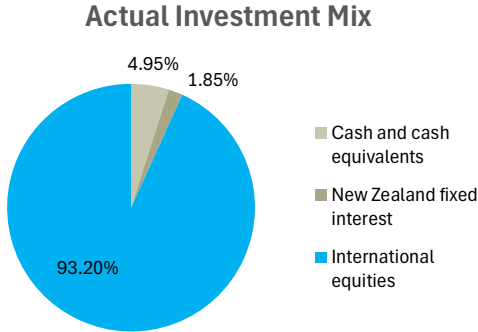
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Lily had \$10,000 in the fund at the beginning of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the period, Lily received a return after fund charges were deducted of \$1312. (That is 13.12% of her initial \$10,000). Lily also paid \$30 in administration charges. This gives Lily a total return after tax and charges of \$1282 for the period.

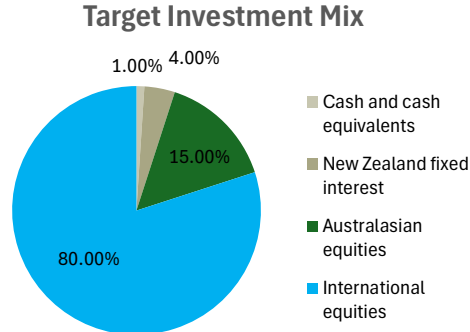
## What does the fund invest in?

The fund's exposure to assets denominated in foreign currencies was 93.25%, of which 0% was hedged. This means the fund's unhedged foreign currency exposure was 93.25% of the net asset value of the fund.

## Notes

1 .As the fund started on 9 December 2024, actual returns for the fund are not available until then. To calculate the risk indicator for the five-year period ending 31 December 2025, market index returns have been used up to 9 December 2024 with actual fund returns used for the balance of the period. As a result of those market returns, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund.
