### What is the purpose of this update?

This document tells you how the Growth Fund has performed and what fees were charged. The document will help you to compare the fund with other funds. Forsyth Barr Investment Management Limited prepared this update in accordance with the Financial Markets Conduct Act 2013. This information is not audited and may be updated.

## Description of this fund

The Growth Fund invests across multiple asset classes, selecting a lesser exposure to cash and fixed interest investments and a greater exposure to equity and property investments. Investors can expect high levels of movement up and down in value. It aims to achieve long-term returns (before fees, taxes and other expenses) greater than **a** composite benchmark.<sup>1</sup>

## What are the risks of investing?

#### Example of how this applies to an investor

Jane had \$10,000 in the fund at the start of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year, Jane received a return after fund charges were deducted but before tax of \$337 (that is 3.37% of her initial \$10,000). This gives Jane a total return after tax of \$278 for the year.

The top 10 investments make up 32.07% of the fund.

Foreign currency exposures associated with international fixed interest are hedged to the New Zealand dollar. We actively manage the fund's foreign currency exposures associated with international and Australian equities, and listed property. As at 31 March 2025, these exposures represented 53.54% of the value of the fund. After allowing for foreign currency hedges in place, 22.08% of the value of the fund was unhedged and exposed to foreign currency risk.
